

# Wild Hog Foraging

**\* Please do NOT attempt to trap or kill these animals on your own.**

**\* Please DO be careful if walking by yourself or with a pet between dusk and dawn.**

The following is info put out by the Federation of Kings Point Associations about what is being done to address the issue so far:

- Documentation and monitoring of the damage through the POC process
- A hunter/trapper has been hired and a feeding area established to attract the hogs so they can be killed
- The Federation is in contact with the RSW Group (for Maplewood and Oakley Green) and Minto
- The Federation Director Jim Ayotte is in contact with experts in Texas to gather info and find solutions
- Minto has indicated potential plans to reinforce fencing between Oakley Green and the Preserve/Park
- The Federation and Minto have been in touch with Club Link about the potential for them to reinforce fencing between the golf course and the Preserve
- Federation VP Forrest Davis has been in contact with county officials regarding trappers licensed by the state for additional assistance and has called Senator Storm's office to seek assistance from state officials regarding hog eradication within the state park

In addition, the state park ranger in charge of the park from which our hog problem emanates attended the last Federation meeting. According to Enrico, she said she has replaced/added 3,000 feet of new fence and is searching for a contractor to remove the hogs. She also will add 3 new traps in the park.
